<b>Overall Approaches To Effective Practice</b>	Eliot Bank has continued to build on years of striving to provide a rigorous PE offering. The introduction of the PE and sport grant has enabled us to further develop and strengthen the range of PE available to Eliot Bank pupils. We have continued to employ specialist PE company Teachsport and Independent consultant Glen Burt to deliver high quality school curriculum PE. The funding has enabled us to support teachers through team teaching with these specialists to deliver PE, Gymnastics and Dance.	<b>Teachsport £6241</b>
<b>Inclusion</b>	As a completely inclusive school, we provide opportunities for all children to participate in school sports. There are some after school and lunch time clubs which are subsidised for the children who may need interventions for health benefits.  Our popular Get Active Club encourages children to become more physically active and teaches the importance of a healthy lifestyle.	<b>School Budget</b>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Focused teaching of groups in PE</li> </ul> <p>As PE is not used to cover time out of class, the teachers at Eliot Bank work alongside the coaches. Teachsport have worked with Eliot Bank to create assessment to focus on specific skills for each year group each term. This year we are also adding a stamina level, either skips per minute (KS1) or in Key Stage 2 the beep test. These will enable us to track performance across the year and to provide a baseline for the following years teaching. We provide staff meetings for teachers to further develop their understanding with our providers.</p>	
<b>Swimming</b>	<p>At Eliot Bank we are very proud of the swimming provision we have in place.</p> <p>All year 3 and year 4 children go swimming every term, this means that at Eliot Bank your child will enjoy 6 terms of swimming lessons. It is our desire that all children leave Eliot Bank as competent swimmers. This volume of lessons creates a genuine possibility for all children to be able to reach the Government's expected level of being able to swim 25m unaided.</p> <p>(For annual swimming gala see below)</p>	<b>School Budget</b>
<b>Emphasis On Inter-School/ Intra-School Competition</b>	<p>Through our links with Lewisham sports coaches we have joined other local schools in a series of Lewisham Sports Festivals. These provide regular opportunities for high quality inter school competitions in a range of areas, from basketball to tennis.</p> <p>This year will participate in an all- inclusive multi-skills competition to enable even more children to experience the fun of competitive sport.</p> <p>We provide release for teaching staff to take teams of children to the inter school competitions. Our swimming team take part in local swimming Galas.</p> <p>We take part in three inter/intra school competitions a year, every child taking part in speed bounce, skipping and chest push. Speed bounce requires the children to jump side to side with feet together over an obstacle as many times as they can in two minutes. 	the same time. For chest push the children push a ball away from their chest and the distance it travels until it first bounces is measured.	
<b>Football</b>	We have a Boys and Girls football team who participate in the Lewisham Football League at Blackheath on Saturdays. We hold 3 separate annual Sports Days for each Key Stage, an Early Years Sports Day, as well as a KS1 and KS2 event.	<b>£500</b>
<b>Sports Days</b>	We hold 2 separate annual Sports Days for each Key Stage, an Early Years and KS1 and KS2 event. This is held on our local sports field.	<b>£200</b>
<b>Wake And Shake</b>	Every Wednesday morning, the whole school comes together to participate in a fun dance assembly. The Wake and Shake is led by children who have volunteered and class teachers.	<b>School Budget</b>
<b>Nurturing Talent</b>	There are various opportunities for children with exceptional sporting talent including talent identification screening. We have links in the community with Sydenham Lawn Tennis and Lewisham Thunder Basketball team.	<b>£500</b>
<b>Wider Role Of School Sport</b>	Pupils in Years 6 are encouraged to apply for the schools Young Leaders programme. As Young Leaders they support younger children to play games at break time. Year 6 children support KS1 and EYFS sports days, modelling the activities and guiding their younger peers.  We have an extensive extracurricular sports programme.	<b>School Budget</b>
<b>Effective Use Of Audits Of Practice</b>	As well as the assessments tracking performance we will also conduct a pupil audit termly to assess the impact of the improved provision on attitudes and behaviour in / during sports. Measure the number of children taking part in extracurricular sporting opportunities. We endeavour to encourage pupil premium children to take up as many of the opportunities available as they can.	<b>School Budget</b>
<b>Use Of Volunteers</b>	We participate in the Bikeability, 'Cycling Proficiency', programme in year 6. We have volunteers who take groups to play Tennis and Tag Rugby. Every year the school community collect thousands of Get Active vouchers to support sport and healthy	<b>School Budget</b>

<b>Outdoor Learning Experiences</b>	KS2 have a new orienteering scheme within the school grounds in response to the New Curriculum. In Year 5, all children go on a residential trip to Arethusa for a week. Here they learn to take managed risks and to work together in a team.	<b>School Budget</b>
<b>Using Mentors</b>	In addition to older Eliot Bank children supporting younger peers we have made links with a local secondary school Forest Hill Boys who have performed their dance routines to inspire our children to participate and enjoy dance.	<b>School Budget</b>
<b>Increasing The Participation Of Pupil Premium Children And Girls</b>	We have an established girls' football team. Pupil premium children are invited to attend clubs and funding is used to offer a subsidized cost for all clubs	<b>£359</b>
