SUMMER READING CLUB

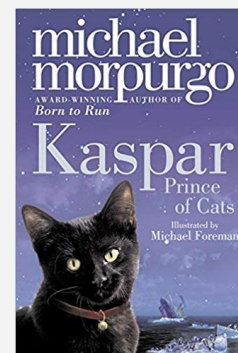

'Kaspar Prince of Cats' by Michael Morpurgo

Do you like cats? Do you like history? If yes then 'Kaspar Prince of Cats' by Michael Morpurgo is a book for you! Set at the end of the Edwardian era in 1912, Kaspar stays in the Savoy Hotel London, with his owner the beautiful Russian Opera singer the Countess Kandinsky. Only he shouldn't be in the hotel as cats are not allowed! Johnny Trott, the Bell Boy of the Savoy, helps look after Kaspar during his stay and all is fine until an unfortunate turn of events. After making friends with a young American heiress Lizziebeth, Johnny and Kaspar embark on an adventure on a very famous ship indeed bound for New York. However, disaster strikes aboard the ship! What happens to Johnny and Kaspar? Well, you'll have to read the book to find out.....

This is one my most favourite books for children ever. It has many cliff hangers at the end of each chapter and this period of history fascinates children. It's an exciting book with captures the children's attention from start to finish. It was such a great read that I may have even shed a tear at the end. To see why, then you should read it too! Be warned though - you won't want to put it down. Recommended for children aged 8+
