
Well done to Miss Van Wyk's class (1RV) & Ms Angyalova's Class (5CF) who shared the Attendance Cup last week.

MOG on Fox Night, by Judith Kerr

This is a fantastic story about a cheeky cat called Mog and some mischievous foxes. One evening Mog refuses to eat her food and Mr Thomas decides he's had enough and outside she must go. In the snow Mog feels cold and alone until she wakes from a snooze to find some young foxes are playing with the rubbish bags. Mog decides she has had enough of the foxes and runs through the cat door only to have them run in right behind her! This story follows the foxes as they get up to no good.
