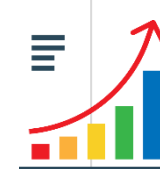
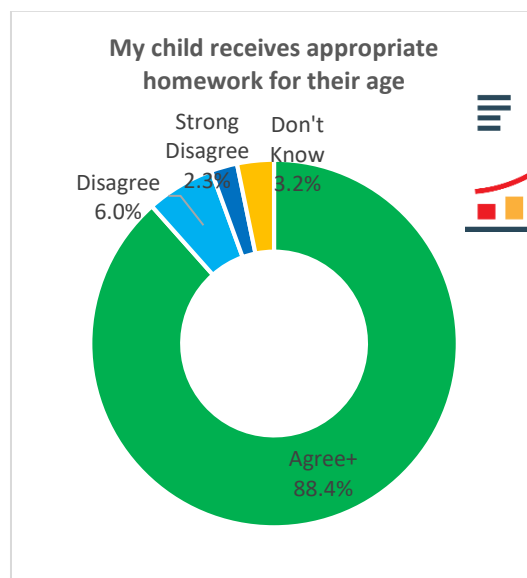
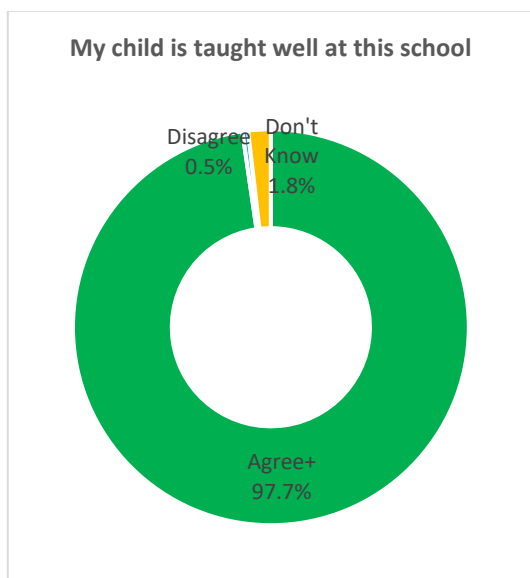
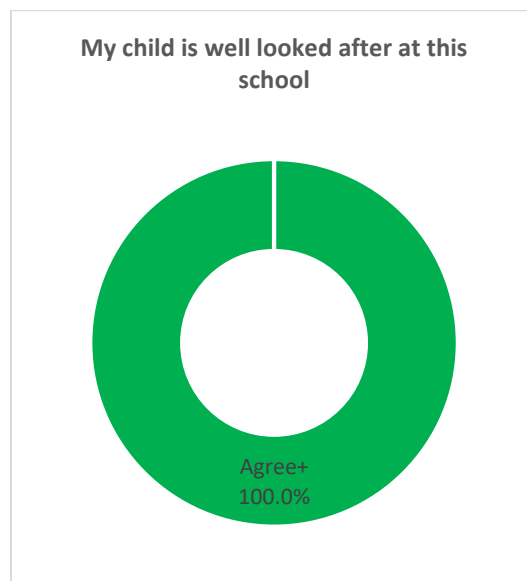
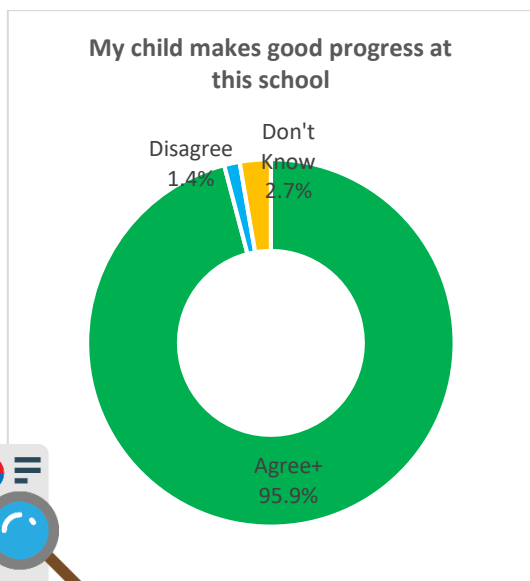
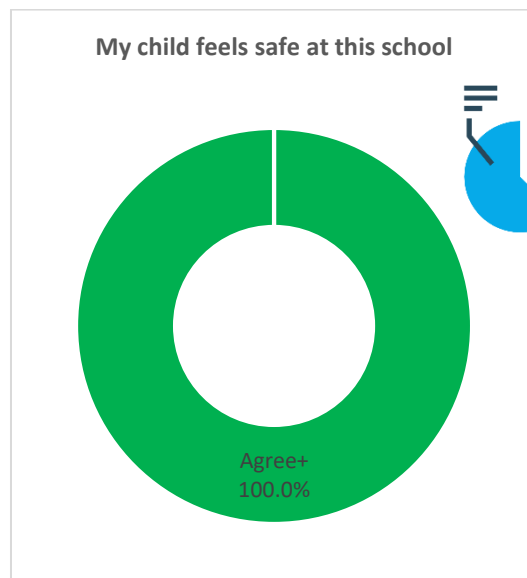
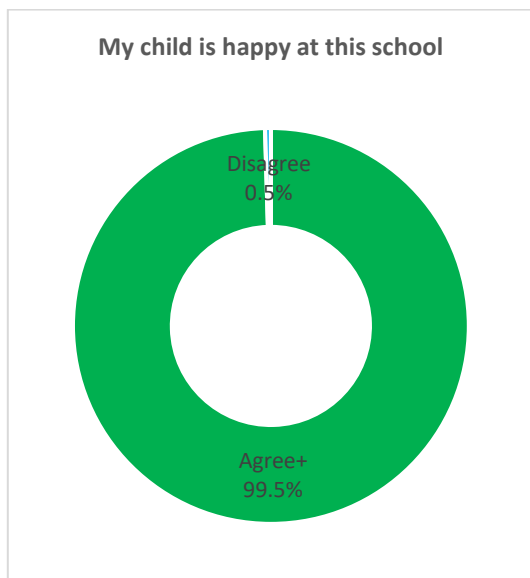
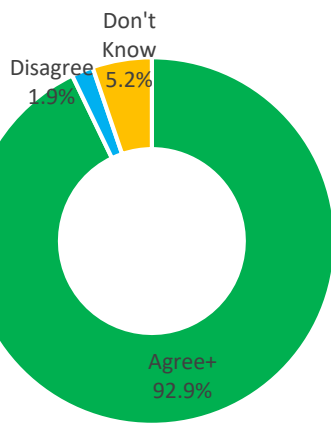


PARENT QUESTIONNAIRE OUTCOMES – AUTUMN 2018

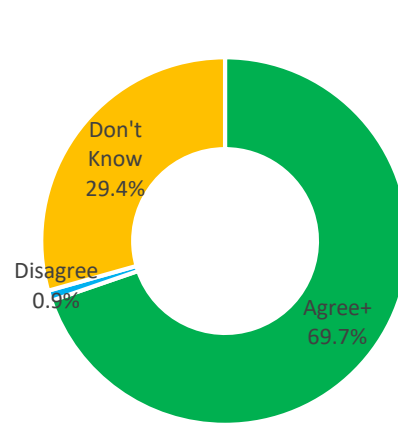

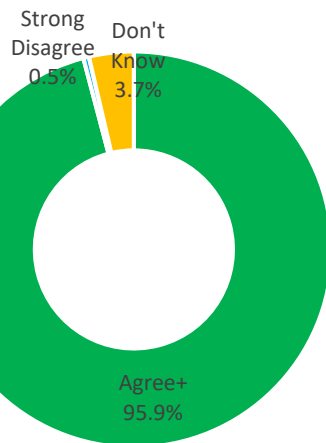
The school ensures the pupils are well behaved



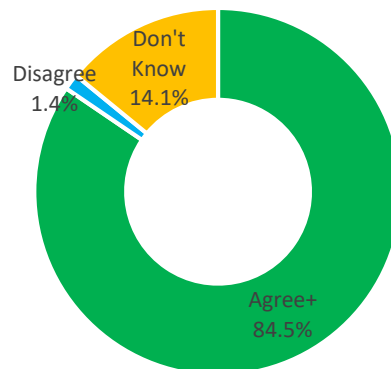
The school deals effectively with bullying



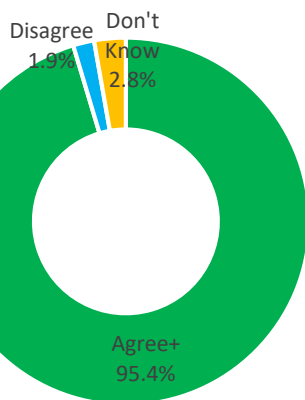

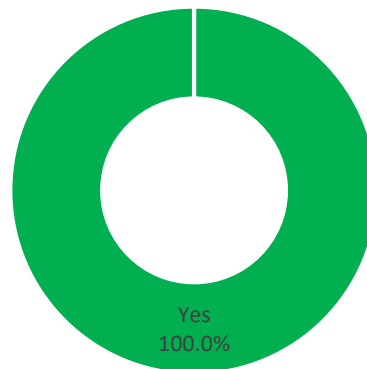
The school responds well to any concerns I raise

Many of the 'Don't Know' responses were from parents of children in Nursery and Reception. We appreciate that in the early stages of your child's schooling, many of you have had limited experience of Eliot Bank. We will conduct a similar survey at the Summer Term parents' evening, so we hope that you feel more able to share your experiences after a full academic year.

In addition to the strongly agree and agree tick responses, we were inundated with positive comments. We will share a selection of these with you in our newsletter in the New Year.

Feedback from parents is important to us. We received 220 responses. In areas where agree+ falls below 90%, we have drawn up the following responses:

The school deals effectively with bullying

We are reassured that the 'Don't Knows' are likely as a result of the fact that your child has not been bullied. However, we realise it might be the case that you are not familiar with our robust bullying policy and procedures. We shared a leaflet with you last year, outlining our protocols for dealing with bullying and we have planned for another Special-Edition Newsletter (Children's Takeover!) in the Spring Term, which will focus on our on-going anti-bullying efforts at Eliot Bank.

My child receives appropriate homework for their age

In response to our home learning survey last academic year, we reshaped our home learning expectations over the summer break. We have introduced a new reading journal this year and clearly defined our expectations for home learning in class newsletters and on the school website. Further to this, we have improved the home learning section on our school website (Parents > Home Learning) and made available for download our project-based Take-Away tasks for each year group, for the whole year. These actions taken by the school appear to be reflected in your responses compared to last year: we have received fewer 'Strongly Disagree' responses.

The school responds well to any concerns I raise

We are reassured that the 'Don't Knows' are likely as a result of the fact that you have not raised a concern so don't know how well the school responds. When a parent raises a concern with the school, it is always our aim to look into the matter for you and offer reassurances as quickly as possible.
