
## READING COMPREHENSION WEEK BEGINNING 29TH JUNE YEAR 2

era


a period of time of which particular events or stages of development are typical:

a device that uses lenses to make very small objects look larger, so that they can be scientifically examined and studied:


magnify

Don't move forward in the slides without answering the questions first or you'll spoil the story.



What kind of person do you think the boy is? Explain why






What do you think the boy is thinking when he sees this mysterious box?



How is the boy feeling outside the photoshop? How does the author show this?



















From these underwater scenes (previous two slides as well) which is your favourite picture? Mrs Morris has a favourite!




When the boy looks at these photos, why do you think he is surprised?

When the boy looks at the camera, what do you think he says to himself?






Why does he throw the camera back into the sea and not keep it?
