The school has decided to mark the occasion with a non-uniform 'Superhero' dress-up day on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> March. Our theme will be 'Our Strengths,' and will link to the 'Superhero' theme. We would like the children to think about what they consider to be their strengths and come up with a suitable 'Superhero' name. Your child might focus on a particular skill they have, such as swimming, baking, cycling or playing an instrument. They could become Super Swimmer, Bailey the Baking Hero or Musical Muhammad.
