**Take-Away Tasks** provide your child with optional homework opportunities, linked to this term's History topic - Toys:

## Are toys of today better than toys from the past?

As well as daily reading and weekly mathematics homework, your child may wish to do additional home learning from the Take-Away tasks below.



### Be a toy maker!

Use your recycling at home to make a model of a toy for our toyshop.



### Be a historian!

Interview your grown-ups at home about the toys they used to play with. Write a report together about the differences between their toys now and your toys.1530



### Go and play!

Go to your local playground and explore all the different equipment. Take some pictures and label them.



### Counting teddies!

Gather all your teddies together and count how many you have. Then count how many eyes and ears they have in total.



### Can you be an artist?

Find your favourite toy and study it carefully before creating an observational drawing of it.



### 'Jamaica's Find'

Write your own version of 'Jamaica's Find'. Who is your character and what sort of toy will they find?
