Welcome to the Reception class newsletter—full of key information for the term ahead. This term, our context for learning is:

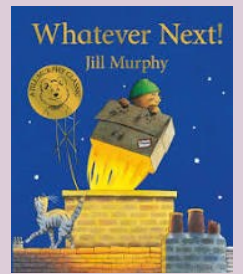
Space

Literacy

The books that we are focusing on link to our topic, Space, and include *Whatever Next*, *Aliens love Underpants*, *Bob the Man on the Moon*, and non-fiction books about space. The children will begin to hold a sentence in their head before writing it down. Their writing will include initial sounds, and digraphs. A digraph has two letters that make one sound, e.g. 'sh'.



Maths

In Maths we will be working on developing our ability to subitising numbers to 5. Subitising means to recognise quantities without counting. You could support your child in this by looking out for the familiar patterns that quantities make (for example, 4 dots on dice are always in a square shape). We will use a mastery approach to learn all about the numbers 6, 7 and 8. We will consider skills within these numbers such as number bonds, adding and taking away, more and less and doubling and halving. Always encourage your child to look out for numbers and symbols on buses, houses (odds and evens) and in the environment.

Understanding of the World



We are learning about Space and writing our own space fact books, making equipment for our space station and creating lots of space-themed art. We are even using 'space rocks' and planets to help us with our Maths. Please help your child to

research answers to their questions by looking in books or by carrying out safe searches on the internet.

Next half term, we will learn about animals - naming animals and the differences between how they look, what they eat and where they live.



Music

We will be having weekly Music lessons with our specialist teacher, Mr Prescott. He will be teaching us songs to help us remember the names of the planets. In Music Appreciation we will listen to the music of Gustav Holst, David Bowie, Hans Zimmer and a little bit of the Prodigy.

Indoor PE this term will be on Tuesdays and outdoor PE will be on Thursdays. Please ensure your child wears their full kit to school on these days. We are learning ball skills—throwing, catching and rolling. You could

Reminders
