<u>Year i exciting events</u>

Year 1 have experienced two exciting events recently. Following on from our recent trip to the Horniman Museum, where we explored a range of toys from different cultures, last Thursday, we welcomed some of our parents and grandparents into the classrooms to share with us toys that they used to play with when they were young. The children loved hearing about why these toys were special to the grown-ups and playing with them. They also asked some great questions and learnt that many toys people played with in the recent past are similar to some of the toys they play with now. This week, we visited Baxter's Field to support our DT and science topics. In DT, we will be designing and making our own piece of playground equipment so we made some close observations of the equipment at Baxter's Field playground thinking especially about the shapes, the materials and how pieces are joined together. We sketched some of the equipment and took photos of the equipment to help us when we get started on this project in school very soon. We also took the opportunity to be nature detectives, spotting changes in the natural environment at this time of year and identifying a range of different leaves - this all links to our science topic on seasonal changes, which will stretch across the whole of Y1. Thank you to all our parents and carers who volunteered to come into class or help us on the trip - we very much appreciate it.

Year 5 trip to the British Museum

As part of our history topic, we ventured to the British Museum last week and marvelled at artefacts from the Anglo-Saxon era. We were given tablets to guide us on our tour of the room, which used augmented reality technology to develop historical inquiry skills and engage with the past in exciting and innovative ways. We learnt about the Sutton Hoo burial and what the objects found within can tell us about Anglo-Saxon society, religion and culture.

<u>Reminder</u> If your child is Asthmatic or has an Epi-pen, please bring in the Inhaler pump or Epi-pen and give it to an adult.


Maths challenge of the Week
